### ISRAEL

a land that is both the oldest and the youngest, a country small in area, but immense in its history. A land of contrasts. It's geography, and it's climate. Burning hot desert divides richly cultivated groves. Two million people have flocked to this land from 75 countries throughout the world.

Mr. Cohn's recent travels in Israel included the three main cities of Tel Aviv - Jaffa, Haifa, and Jerusalem, as well as Bethesda, Ashkelon, and the new port of Ashdod. In Jerusalem, for instance, more than anywhere else, one senses the precarious situation of this country which is surrounded almost completely with hostile states. The city is split by a demarcation line. Where you expect to find peace and solace, you are face to face with a latent state of war.

Via his beautiful color slides, Mr. Cohn will take us to King Solomon's mines at Eilat, to Caesarea, where the Bible relates David fought the lions, and to many other Christian shrines. At this day of history in its turbulent making, we are indeed most fortunate to have this first-hand, interesting report by Mr. Cohn.

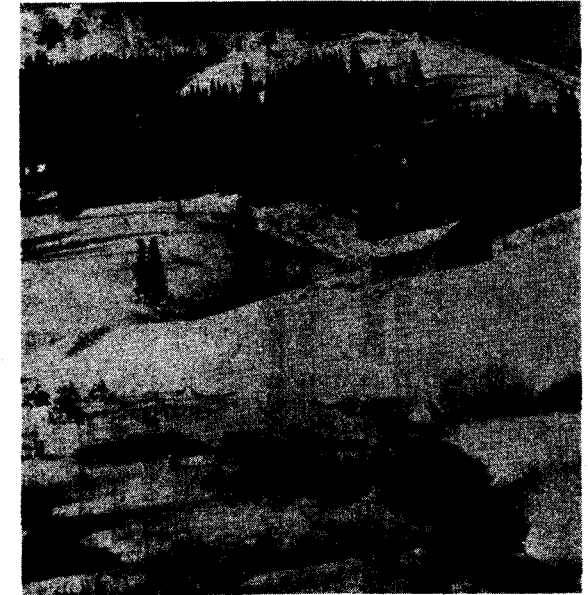
