Dr. Margret Wrenn Rhinehart is a native Tennessean who graduated from the medical school of Loma Linda University at Los Angeles in 1951 and interned at Los Angeles County General Hospital. Since her return to Tennessee, she has been in General Practice at Spencer where she avidly follows her hobby of photographing wildflowers.

Tennessee has probably the greatest variety of wildflowers of any state east of the Mississippi River. Indeed, it is believed that many flowering plants of the Atlantic coastal plain had their origin on the Cumberland Plateau at some 2000 feet elevation.
