CHATTANOOGA MY HOME TOWN

Here are a few assignments for this project that you can assign yourself in the next few weeks. We do need your help! Won't you please pick a few or all listed here and get started!

1. At the National Cemetary - Photograph a military funeral. Do this before the trees leaf out. Sometime within the next several weeks. Would like to have one slide of the playing of "Taps". I think the funerals are only held on Tuesdays and Thursdays, you should check this before you start.
2. Warner Park - While the Iris are in bloom. Be sure to have people in the scenes. Get some closeups! Later, when the rose garden is at its peak, we need slides showing the gardens with people and again with closeups.
3. A large church some Sunday morning just as the morning service is over. Include people leaving the church, etc.
4. Provident Building - From the south side to show the landscaping and blooming shrubs and trees and flowers. Do one some noonday when flowers are out and the girls are having their lunch hour there. Be sure to include plenty of people. This same scene at night would be a good bet. The fountains, lights, etc.
5. Hamilton County Courthouse - The flowers and landscaping should be your target. We have plenty of the building itself. Include the flowerplanted walks with people walking, and with people on the benches near the walks, etc.
6. The fountain on the east side of courthouse.
7. Chattanooga My Home Town title slides. We can use a LOT of different title slides, all having in some fashion, the bumper sticker CMHT - here are a few suggestions:
